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Food Handlers and Vaccinations

Two concurrent Hepatitis A breakouts in September 2016, have spurred a discussion on whether vaccinating food handlers would quell the spread of the infection and consequential litigation.

Hepatitis A can be prevented through vaccination. However, should vaccination of certain high-risk groups, such as food handlers, be mandatory? Is this feasible and, if so, would it be effective? Who would bear the cost? Who would oversee the mandate?
